Capital Campaign & Construction Update

The ground work has been completed at the expansion site and we've had several exciting commitments to our Capital Campaign. Winkler Co-op kicked off 2023 with a \$250,000 gift - their largest one time donation ever! In February, we announced that the Cities of Morden and Winkler and RM of Stanley will commit \$3.6 million to the expansion. The RM of Dufferin has also confirmed a contribution of \$282,273 and the Town of Carman will support the expansion with \$345,654. Donations from the community continue to come in, most notably from the Morden Community Thrift Shop, who helped launch the Building for the Future campaign with a gift of \$1 million back in October. Precision Land Solutions Inc. has committed \$100,000 and Little Morden Services Ltd. has come in with a gift of \$50,000. Thank you for all your support to date!
